Sign Language Class Visits Gallaudet

ach year, Chris Busse helps me teach some basic sign language to the new volunteers in the village. This year, Chris wanted the class to visit Gallaudet University, the only university in the world for deaf people. So, as a special trip to finish up our class, a group of 13 volunteers and coworkers piled in the big gray van and headed up to D.C. one Sunday in April. Sebastian, Connie, Katie, Chris L., Ilona, Jenny, Andrea, Freddy, Anna, Chris B., Kathleen and I spent the day wandering the campus, and putting our new sign language skills to use, as we asked for directions and information. After eating in the campus dining hall, we found the campus library where we got a very special introduction to the university from one of the librarians there. We told her about Innisfree too, and she was very intrigued! Her sign language skills were amazing, inspiration for us to practice, practice, practice!!!!! Chris got to ask her about "TTY", and asked her to show and explain it to us. TTY is a phone adaptation that transcribes verbal sounds over the phone into



written form for a deaf person to read, and then can work the same in reverse. Our librarian and stand-in tour guide showed us several versions—even one set up on their pay phones in the library. Chris was most enthusiastic about seeing TTY.

We also enjoyed browsing the shelves in the library to find endless resources on sign language education. Chris found one book that he especially liked called "Signing in 14 Different Languages", and asked to buy one. The Gallaudet Bookstore was closed that day, but we have been able to obtain copy through a Charlottesville store, so Chris has his own copy now, as does the sign language class. We are excited to have this new and valuable resource for our multi-lingual group of volunteers!

We all had a great trip and Chris is wanting to go back again. Sometimes they have special events going on over the weekend that might make for another fun trip. Thanks to Chris for the idea, we are so glad we went!

Pobert Smith moved to Innisfree in June 1980. He was a good friend to many and a hard worker, who loved adventure, the circus, bagpipes, fire trucks, and disassembling electronics. 


